RULES:

- Incoming 1st through 6th graders for the 2018-2019 school year can enter.
- The contest begins May 31st and ends August 4th
- You must read the books by yourself and in their entirety for them to count.
- **GRAPHIC NOVELS WILL COUNT** - ½ the total number of pages
- * Each week you log at least **one book**, you will receive a prize drawing slip and a chance to pick from the prize box (up to 8).
- Challenge yourself! Read books appropriate for your age and reading level. **If we feel you are reading too many easy books, we may subtract pages!**
- This year we will randomly hand out book reviews at check-in. The librarians will randomly pass out a short book review form asking a question about one of the books you have read. If the question is not answered correctly, you will not receive credit for the book.
- Being dishonest will result in immediate disqualification.
- **Books returned in the drop box cannot be counted.** If we are closed for a holiday or it is the weekend, you will not be charged late fees if returned the next business day.
- Readers must write down all their titles and the pages in the librarians' log. If the pages are not numbered or noted in the back of the book, leave it blank and we will count them up.

- **PRIZES!** Incentives will be given throughout the reading contest. We want everyone to **HAVE FUN** reading!
- * First, second, and third place trophies will be awarded for each grade based on page numbers.
